

## PRELIM 1: REGRADE REQUESTS AND CORRECTIONS

### 1 Regrade Requests (optional)

Here is the course policy for requesting regrades on Prelim problems, as posted on the course webpage on Moodle. If you think there's a mistake in the way your test was scored...

- \* Answers are posted when Prelims are returned. Check those **first**.
- \* If there is an **addition** mistake, have your instructor check it over.
- \* Challenges to the scoring of any question go back to the person who graded it. Write a brief **explanation** of what you think the mistake was and give your appeal (and exam booklet) to your instructor. If you'd like to discuss your appeal with your instructor first, that's fine. He or she can offer you advice. Keep in mind that different graders may make different decisions regarding partial credit; ultimately a very important thing is that everyone's paper is graded consistently. Questions of how much partial credit a particular answer "is worth" rarely succeed in a change.

### 2 Corrections (mandatory)

1. If you earned a score of 90 points or more on Prelim 1, you do not need to rewrite any of your problems. You will receive full marks for this assignment. You may turn in a rewrite if you like — it is good practice!
2. If you earned less than 90 points on Prelim 1, then you must rewrite **two** of the problems on which you lost the most points.
3. First, give an **explanation** (in correct English!) of **WHY** you could not do each problem — "I forgot which formula to use", "I got mixed up on the IVT", "I was just completely confused and didnt understand the problem", et cetera.
4. Second, write a **solution** to each problem as perfectly as you can — with all details and explanations, clearly showing your work. To receive full credit you must turn in your corrections with both questions **correctly** answered.
5. This assignment will count towards your section grade.
